We have so much to be thankful for as we finish the first term at Cornerstone. We have enjoyed varied courses such as History of Mission, Church Planting and Ethics. So far, the majority of classes have taken place in person with very occasional meetings on Zoom, we are very grateful for this. We are conscious more than ever of the privilege it is to study here and experience such tailored preparation for cross-cultural ministry.

We are also rejoicing that Esther has been able to recommence Mother and Toddler meetings, with the help of two other students. Restrictions severely limit the number of people we can welcome to these gatherings, but we have one regular contact who comes with her son, and another mum who shows keen interest. Ben's homeless outreach has not been able to take place, but he is involved in an online ministry, running sessions to excite and encourage people's interest in world mission. As you can imagine, there are lots of things that need to fall into place in order for any of these events to come to pass. From the purchase of an appropriate vehicle for our needs, to the search for accommodation and decisions regarding language study options (in Moldova and/or Romania) ...among many other things. Sometimes the magnitude of what lies ahead overwhelms us, but it also drives us to our knees in prayer, we know that the God who has faithfully led us so far, will not leave us now.

### CASA MEA PRAYER POINTS

- Sadly, at the time of writing, a number in Casa Mea are ill with COVID-19 related symptoms. This
  includes people living in two of the four homes as well as members of staff. Pray particularly for
  Serafima and Aliona in Casa Bucuriei.
- Please continue to pray for those living in state disability institutions, we do not have any
  further information about the effects of COVID-19 there, but we know that the institution we
  have visited most often has experienced a number of cases. There are a number of believers
  there and many more who have heard the Gospel. Pray that God will protect and have mercy on
  many souls in these days.
- Pray for many across Moldova who are marginalised because of disability. Pray that God will raise up labourers to bring the good news of Jesus to these neglected peoples.
- Moldova has recently elected a new President, Maia Sandu (a pro-European candidate). Pray for her as she assumes her new role. She has vowed to purge Moldova of political and judicial systems of corruption. Pray that God will use her as a force for good and that the country will not experience any unrest.
- Praise God with us for the 5-year anniversary of Casa Ana, the most recent Casa Mea house, home to 6 women who were previously institutionalised. They held a service of celebration in their local church.
- Pray for the future of the work. There are many ongoing changes and transitions and potential for a new house in the coming years.
